


PREFACE

The World Economy 2018

Economic growth accelerated in more than half the world's economies in both 2017 and 2018. Developed economies expanded at a steady pace of 2.2 per cent in both years, and growth rates in many countries have risen close to their potential, while unemployment rates in several developed economies have dropped to historical lows.

Among the developing economies, the regions of East and South Asia remain on a relatively strong growth trajectory, expanding by 5.8 per cent and 5.6 per cent, respectively in 2018. However, leading economists claim that the current global expansion will likely continue into next year, given that the US is running large fiscal deficits, China is pursuing loose fiscal and credit policies, and Europe remains on a recovery path. But by 2020, the conditions could be ripe for a financial crisis, followed by a possible global recession.

European Union: Fiscal policy in the European Union is expected to have a neutral impact on growth in 2018–2019, with many countries shifting away from austerity in recent years. Across the region, stronger GDP growth and significant labour market gains have driven cyclical improvements in budget balances, by boosting tax revenues and reducing welfare expenditures.

MESSAGE OF THE GENERAL SECRETARY

Univ.-Prof. Dr. Norbert W. Knoll von Dornhoff

On the Importance of Life Expectancy of Smaller Enterprises for Economic Growth and Employment

The European Commission stated in the Annual Report on European SMEs 2017/2018 that the number of SMEs in the EU-28 increased by 13,8% between 2008 and 2017. The number of newborn SMEs markedly exceeded the actual decrease in SME population because of the high mortality rate of SMEs, especially among young entrepreneurs. Each new SME that serviced over the period 2012 to 2018 required the birth of 9 (nine) SMEs. That did not happen.

We have information from the USA, Europe and Asian and African Countries claiming that averagely 20% (in some countries more) of small businesses fail in their first year, 30% of small business fail in their second year, and 50% of small businesses fail after five years in business. Finally, 70% of small business owners fail in their 10th year in business. Businesses in the health care and social assistance industries tend to have the highest survival rates, while the construction and transportation and warehousing industries tend to have the lowest survival rates. Contrary to popular belief, restaurants are not more likely to fail than any other industry.

Small businesses fail for several reasons, but the most common reasons include a lack of demand, poor management, and cash flow issues. Generally, entrepreneurs seeking small business financing found the most success with alternative lenders, rather than traditional banks. Small businesses make up in all countries of the world the vast majority of the firms. Overall, more and more small businesses are opening their doors. In particular, the rates of women- and minority-owned small businesses have recently increased.

In the classical model of a free-market economy, the departure of a provider of goods and services from the market has no further economic relevance. Therefore, it would be politically wrong to keep these companies alive in times of crisis. But the reality is different.

Market economies are not perfect these days. Social and environmental corrections, globalization and many other global risks are demanding crisis prevention for SMEs and crafts.

There are no doubts today that the number of SMEs decisively influences the business cycles and contributes to the growth of the Gross National Product (GDP per capita, PPP) and considerably mitigates approaching crises. In the crisis years of 2008 and 2009, GDP growth in Europe and worldwide has fallen dramatically. Much less in Austria. The precautionary measures were taken by special financial institutions, and the comprehensive range of advisory services offered by the Chambers of Commerce largely prevented SME bankruptcies. Austria could secure the prosperity of its population more successfully than in most other countries of world.

Conclusion: In the forthcoming years, WUSME will support the reduction of the SME mortality rate in addition to the further developping SMEs and crafts, and integrate crisis prevention into the "Stairway to Success".

On Monday, July 16th 2018, the Board Special Committee of WUSME held a meeting in the San Marino Headquarters. Members of the Committee present: Gian Franco Terenzi, Giorgio Battistini, Loretta Menicucci and Biagio Riccio.

The agenda of the meeting covered a wide range of issues, among which the acknowledgement of the Cooperation Agreements signed with the AFRICA SMB FORUM and the Chinese People's Association for Friendship with Foreign Countries; the renewal of the agreement signed in 2014 with UNAS (National Union of Craftsmen of San Marino) and the Secretariat of State for Industry of the Republic of San Marino on international vocational training; the appointment of new WUSME Ambassadors in Croatia, Papua New Guinea, Singapore, Poland, Algeria, Tunisia, South Africa, Ireland and Mongolia; the approval of the Annual Report for 2017 and the appointment of Prof. Charles Wang as main representative of the Traditional Chinese Medicine within the WUSME platform for the LIFE SCIENCE in Shanghai.

On Wednesday, October 10th 2018, the WUSME Board Special Committee held a meeting in the Headquarters of San Marino.

Present President Gian Franco Terenzi and Board Members Giorgio Battistini, Loretta Menicucci and Biagio Riccio, who met to discuss and express their opinion on subject matters relating to the most recent or forthcoming activities of the Organization.

The agenda covered a wide range of issues, among which the recent participation of President Terenzi at the "International Forum of Former World Leaders" in China, the Cooperation Agreements signed with Chinese SMEs organizations, such as the CASME (China Association of Small and Medium Enterprises), the expected participation of WUSME at COP24 in December 2018 as NGO admitted as Observer, the prospect of strengthening WUSME's relationship with the United Nations and the appointment of a new WUSME Ambassadress in China. President Terenzi in China to attend the "International Forum of Former World

Leaders"

4th October, 2018 – WUSME President Gian Franco Terenzi attended an important International Forum of Former World Leaders held from 28 to 30 September 2018 in Beijing. The event corresponded to the 35th Annual Plenary Assembly of the InterAction Council, an international organization bringing together former world leaders to unite their energies, experiences and international contacts and develop and encourage change in the

world.

The forum was attended by eminent representatives of institutions from over 40 countries.

Present many former Heads of State, Prime Ministers and Ministers.

On the occasion, WUSME President met with prominent dignitaries on the institutional scene, such as H.E. the Vice President of the People's Republic of China Mr. WANG

Qishan.

The event focused on highly significant topics, such as artificial intelligence, climate

change and the commercial war affecting the global economy.

9th SINO-EUROPEAN ENTREPRENEURS SUMMIT (SEES)

PARIS (FRANCE) – 6th June, 2018 – The ninth edition of SINO-EUROPEAN ENTREPRENEURS SUMMIT (SEES) was held in Paris (France) on 4rd and 5th June, 2018, hosted by the Federation of Chinese and European Entrepreneurs. The event was also attended by WUSME, International Organization based in the Republic of San Marino committed to supporting Small and Medium Enterprises worldwide and formally recognized by the United Nations by virtue of the Special Consultative Status with ECOSOC since 2013. The summit held in Paris gathered over 500 Chinese and European leaders, entrepreneurs, experts and scholars of the economic and business world. An important occasion, which has become an annual event (eight sessions held in London and Paris since 2008), to conduct in-depth exchanges and discussions on current issues, as well as to strengthen the partnership between Chinese and European entrepreneurs. At the heart of the summit, the "Belt and Road" Initiative proposed by China in 2013, financial innovation China – European Union and globalization. The objective is the promotion of a new model for opening and innovating foreign investments, promoting the connectivity of China-Europe companies and the creation of a large Asia-Europe market.

WUSME at the International SME Convention in New Delhi

NEW DELHI (INDIA) – April 25th, 2018 – Just ended the first INTERNATIONAL SME CONVENTION held in New Delhi (India). The event theme "Business Beyond Borders" has been organized by the Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises of the Government of India in conjunction with WUSME (International Organization committed to supporting SMEs in the world and formally recognized by the United Nations by virtue of the Consultative Status at UN ECOSOC since 2013), INDIA SME FORUM (primary Indian organization in support of SMEs) and with other international organizations from across 30 countries. Over 400 entrepreneurs from India, 160 Small and Medium Enterprises representing 39 countries among which, to name a few, Australia, Austria, Cameroon, France, Ghana, Guinea, Hungary, Indonesia, Italy, Kenya, Korea, Poland, Russia, Spain,

participated in the three days of work. The Convention focused on international best practices for the development and cooperation of SMEs, business opportunities at global level and issues women entrepreneurs tackle. The event focused on strengthening bilateral relations between several countries by hosting specific sectoral focus sessions, from agriculture to health, from strategic defense to education, from digital entertainment to waste management. To represent the WUSME Organization, President Gian Franco Terenzi, always dedicated to SMEs. During his speech, he highlighted the importance of the Convention as moment for international gathering of all those dealing with small and medium-sized enterprises, as well as discussing the difficulties, challenges and opportunities they face. In particular, WUSME President Terenzi stressed how today the new technologies exceed geographical limits and allow people to interact. And he added: "For the first time in many years, technologies, such as the blockchain are offering the community the possibility to achieve an inclusive growth and shared widespread prosperity".

WUSME General Secretary, Norbert Knoll von Dornhoff, recommended in his statement: "SME supporting Organization in India will have to focus on attracting technology transfer (e.g. licenses of foreign companies) to India and promoting exports and business partnerships worldwide. Therefore, they will need a sustainable income for their services, independent of business cycles. Intensified cooperation of Indian Banks, SME Institutions and entrepreneurs with the European Union, e.g. with the EIB - European Investments Bank, the World Bank and IFC, and with United Nations Agencies, e.g. UNIDO and -last not least-with WUSME World Union of SMEs would decisively foster the development."



WUSME at COP24, the UN Conference on climate change in Poland

KATOWICE (Poland) – December 6th, 2018 – WUSME is participating in COP24, the UN World Conference on Climate Change scheduled for December 3-14, 2018 in Katowice, Poland. Present to represent the Organization at the opening ceremony held on December 3rd, 2018, was WUSME Ambassador in Tunisia Mr. Dogad Dogoui. WUSME has always been committed to highlight the importance of the macroeconomic effects of climate change and, in particular, the consequences for the economic and social development of Small and Medium Enterprises in the international context. SMEs, indeed, can provide a significant contribution to the resilience of climate change by implementing policies, directives and guidelines provided by institutions, as well as developing new business opportunities in a context of a sustainable, innovative and decarbonized global economy. Following and referring to the application presented by WUSME for the recognition of the Observer status in the UNFCCC process, the Secretariat gave official communication that the Conference of the Parties (COP), in its 24th session, admitted WUSME to the UNFCCC process as Organization Observer.
